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School of Social Work, IGNOU, in collaboration with Mahama Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE) organises 3 day National Workshop on Skill Building in Social Work Curriculum with a special focus on Skill Building and Multiple Entry & Multiple Exit. The workshop was organised from 5th Jan to 7th Jan 2023 at Centre for Online Education. The welcome of the gathering was done by Shri Dinesh Pandey, MGNCRE. Then Dr. Poonam Gulalia (consultant MGNCRE) presented the Draft Curriculum framework for Skill Integrated Social Work Education to the august gathering. Then Dr. Saumya, Associate Professor, IGNOU introduced the programme to the gathering. She informed the audience about the various programmes offered by the School of Social Work in distance and online mode. She clearly emphasised, its mandate is to reach the tribal, rural and urban aspirants; also the grassroot practitioners to get higher education through the distance/online mode. She also emphasised online and distance mode is the only way to achieve the GER of 50% at higher education level.



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Dr. W.G. Prasanna Kumar, Chairman of MGNCRE, told the importance of skilling in the social work curriculum and make the learners employable with decent income when they leave the course at certificate, diploma or degree and honors level. Each level should provide skills according to that level and provide the income accordingly.





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Prof (Dr) Uma Kanjilal, PVC, IGNOU told NEP is a game changer and it will bring revolution at the higher education level. Use of technology at higher education is prerequisite that is why the government has introduced the National Education Technology Forum. When we try to provide skill, we should emphasise the ICT enabled and integrated pedagogy and curriculum. The education should be holistic and multidisciplinary in nature with a focus at micro level requirements addressing the need of the diverse kind of learners. The curriculum should be flexible and it should also prepared to accommodate the online and distance mode of education. Dr. N. Ramya, Associate Professor, SOSW, IGNOU provided the vote of the thanks to the gatherings.

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On the day 2 of the curriculum workshop, the syllabus was distributed to the faculties. Each faculty received 2-3 courses and they started working as per the mandate of workshop.
