- 1.To enhance competencies related to maternal health
- 2.Identification and referral of High-Risk mothers
- 3.Care during Medical abortions
- 4.Normal Vaginal delivery
- 4.Complete Immunization (RI) and Vitamin A supplementation
- 5.Monitoring and Assisting Village Health Nutrition Days (VHNDs); Social mobilization,
- 6.Home Based New born Care and Care of common new born illnesses
- 7.Educate about Kangaroo mother care
- 8.Use of equipment, e.g. Suction machine, oxygen administrator, ambu-bag, radiant warmer,
- 9.Phototherapy unit, etc.
- 10.Detection & treatment of anaemia and other deficiencies in children and adolescents
- 11.Screening of 4 D's including early detection of growth abnormalities, delays in development and Disability
- 12.Prompt management of ARI and fever, skin infections and acute diarrhoeas
- 13.Adolescent Health- counselling and referral
- 14.Nutritional assessment (including growth chart) and referral as appropriate

- 15.Counseling for Family Planning and emergency contraceptives, Insertion of IUD
- 16.Follow up care after abortion
- 17.Syndromic treatment of RTIs
- 18.Identification and counseling information about Gender Resource centre at District level (linkage with Referral centre and legal support)
- 19.Diagnosis, treatment plan, follow-up diagnostics and management of communicable diseases
- 20.Use of Rapid Diagnostic Testing Kit and Lab testing for common vector-borne diseases
- 21.Management of Common illnesses and common Non-Communicable Diseases
- 22.Detection and referral of mental illness, follow up medication,

- 24.Management of Violence related concerns
- 25.Dental hygiene - Screening for gingivitis, dental caries, oral cancers
- 26.Treatment for glossitis, candidiasis, aphthous ulcers;
