**FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT OF LEARNERS ON THE TEACHING- LEARNING
PROCESS**

1.0: Preamble

Learners in IGNOU are enrolled in various programmes of study offered by the University which imparts instruction in the Open and Distance Learning (ODL) and Online mode. Distance learners have defining characteristics which distinguish them from their conventional counterparts. They are a heterogenous group of adult learners, hailing from diverse backgrounds, physically at a distance from the University, isolated and have social and professional or other commitments. The learners do not visit the Learner Support Centre daily and hence do not have regular face-to-face interaction with teachers, peers and other institution members. However, the learners are self-motivated to pursue higher education and are autonomous learners. To sustain the learner motivation and facilitate progress in the study, the University has a three tier Learner Support System organized at the Headquarters, Regional Centres and Learner Support Centres. The student is provided academic and non-academic support through this mechanism and teaching-learning is imparted using an ICT enabled multiple media approach.

Learners being the end users, their feedback on the teaching-learning process can contribute significantly for the improvement of the system at all levels, i.e., curriculum design, development, programme delivery and learner support systems. The feedback analysis can provide inputs for University academia to ascertain whether learning outcomes are being achieved and also provide insights for strengthening the instructional system.



2.0: About the learner support services

Student Support Services are the most integral part of the Open and Distance Learning. It can be defined as a range of support services to the learners. The support services fall into two broad areas; academic and non-academic.

Academic Support – It deals with supporting learners with cognitive issues pertaining to specific course chosen by the learners. It is provided to learners through counselling sessions, practical and feedback on the assignments etc.

Non-academic Support- It includes affective and organizational aspects of their study, such as informing, advising and counselling them on personal matters that are hindering their study.

In conventional system, class room transactions, peer team interactions and library facility are components of learning while in ODL, multimedia, print, audio, video, radio, TV, teleconferencing and other recent mode of ICTs are important tool for teaching learning platform.

3.0: Methodology

The questionnaire was provided by CIQA and was divided into two parts. In first part, the basic information of the learners and the second part was related to the feedback of learners on Likert's five point rating scale (Strongly agree, Agree, Neutral, Disagree and Strongly disagree), total 15 items were taken related to Induction meeting, academic counselling, SLM, assignment, examination and student support services etc.

The questionnaire was converted into Google form at RSD and the link of Google form was shared with all 56 Regional Centres of IGNOU. The Regional Centres further shared the link with their Learners through SMS and emails. In the present study the descriptive survey method

is being used to find out the result as per the objective of study through questionnaires. Through this Google form, total 54295 learners have submitted their feedback which was analyzed at RSD, IGNOU New Delhi. A profile of learners is as given: Male-53.30% & Female-46.70%, Employed-35.2, Un-employment-64.8 Age group below 20 years-10.40%, 20-30 years - 70.20%, 31-40 years-14.40%, 41-50 years-4.00% and 50 years above-01.00%, Category wise- 54.90% Gen, OBC-25.00%, SC-13.5% and ST-6.6%.

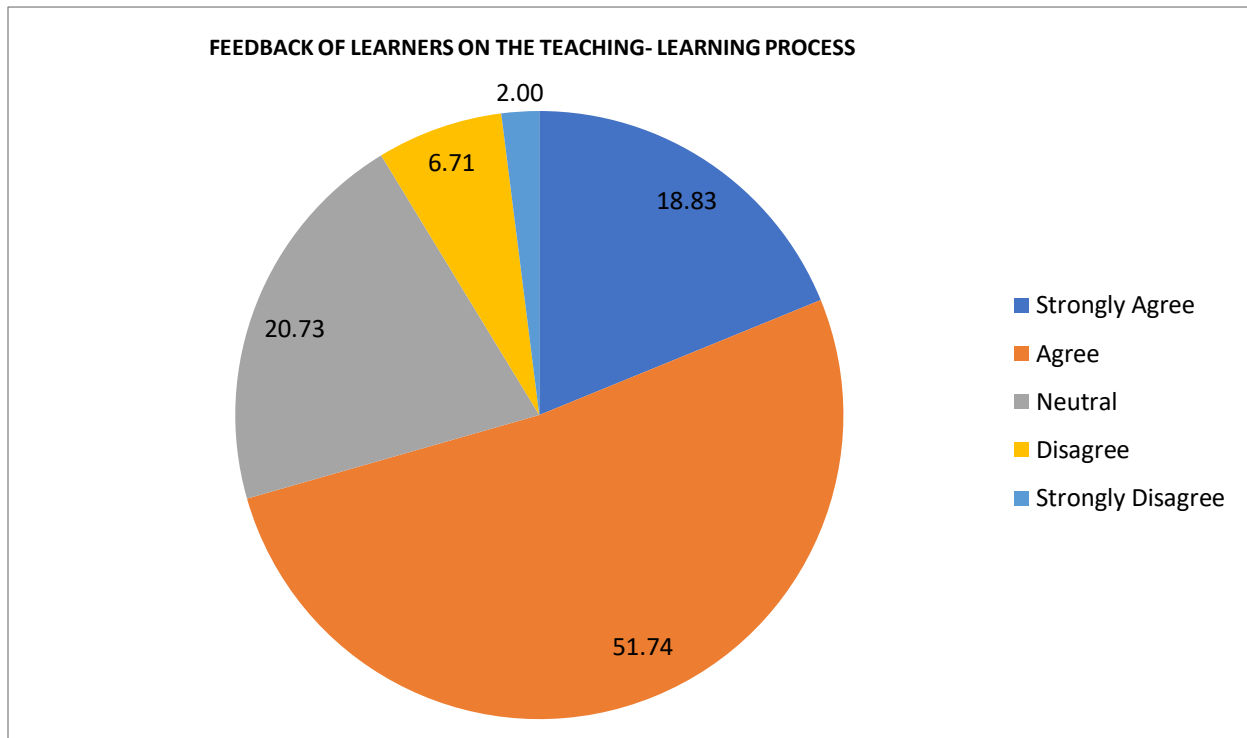
4.0: Feedback of Learners

5.0: Analysis of the Feedback received

Based on above analysis the feedback of Academic Counselors, **the item-wise/question-wise feedback may be concludes** in the following points.

1. **Self Learning Materials (SLM) adequately cover the entire syllabus**-Based on data, It shows 73.90% (Strongly Agreed – 18.90 + Agreed - 55.00) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 18.80% were neutral and only 7.40% Learners of IGNOU were

found more or less disagreed with the statement that Self Learning Materials (SLM) adequately cover the entire syllabus.

2. **Course content (SLM) enhances your knowledge and skills**-It clearly shows 79.00% (Strongly Agreed – 19.70 + Agreed - 59.30) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 16.30% were neutral and only 4.80% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Course content (SLM) enhances your knowledge and skills.
3. **Concepts are clearly presented in the SLM**-It clearly shows 68.50% (Strongly Agreed – 15.90 + Agreed - 52.60) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 22.30% were neutral and only 9.20% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Concepts are clearly presented in the SLM.
4. **Provision of SLM in electronic media is useful for mastering the content**-It clearly shows that 63.30% (Strongly Agreed – 14.30 + Agreed - 49.00) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 26.00% were neutral and only 10.70% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Provision of SLM in electronic media is useful for mastering the content.
5. **Concepts are presented in a proper sequence**-It clearly shows 73.60% (Strongly Agreed – 16.50 + Agreed - 57.10) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 19.30% were neutral and only 7.10% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Concepts are presented in a proper sequence.

6. **The expected Learning Outcomes are clearly stated in the SLM-**It clearly shows 68.40% (Strongly Agreed – 13.70 + Agreed - 54.70) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 23.80% were neutral and only 7.80% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that the expected Learning Outcomes are clearly stated in the SLM.
7. **Employability skills are integrated into the syllabus-**It clearly shows 59.60% (Strongly Agreed – 11.90 + Agreed - 47.70) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 27.70% were neutral and only 12.70% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Employability skills are integrated into the syllabus.
8. **Counselling is essential for studying through ODL mode-**It clearly shows that 72.80% (Strongly Agreed – 21.30 + Agreed - 51.50) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 21.10% were neutral and only 6.10% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Counselling is essential for studying through ODL mode.
9. **You believe in attending counselling sessions-**It clearly shows 75.70% (Strongly Agreed – 24.30 + Agreed - 51.40) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 17.60% were neutral and only 6.80% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that you believe in attending counselling sessions.
10. **Assignments are useful for your studies-**It clearly shows 84.50% (Strongly Agreed – 38.20 + Agreed - 46.30) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 9.30% were

neutral and only 6.30% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Assignments are useful for your studies.

11. **The practical component (if any) is very useful**-It clearly shows 74.40% (Strongly Agreed – 23.70 + Agreed - 50.70) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 20.30% were neutral and only 5.30% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that The practical component (if any) is very useful.
12. **Term End Examination adequately cover the syllabus**-It clearly shows 77.50% (Strongly Agreed – 20.80 + Agreed - 56.70) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 16.50% were neutral and only 6.00% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Term End Examination adequately cover the syllabus.
13. **You receive communication from all University regularly**-It clearly shows 57.40% (Strongly Agreed – 15.10 + Agreed - 42.30) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 21.50% were neutral and only 21.10% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that You receive communication from all University regularly.
14. **Over all you are satisfied with the ODL system**-It clearly shows 66.10% (Strongly Agreed – 14.50 + Agreed - 51.60) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 24.30% were neutral and only 9.60% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that Over all you are satisfied with the ODL system.

15. **The programme will enhance your employability in the job market**-It clearly shows 63.80% (Strongly Agreed – 13.60 + Agreed - 50.20) Learners of IGNOU were more or less agreed, 26.10% were neutral and only 10.10% Learners of IGNOU were found more or less disagreed with the statement that the programme will enhance your employability in the job market.

6.0: Conclusion and recommendations

The above findings are proving with data that more than 71% learners of IGNOU display a positive attitude towards teaching learning process in the Open and Distance Learning system and towards different learner support services in IGNOU, i.e Study material, counselling, assignments, examination and other student support services. Thus, it can be concluded that there is significant positive attitude among the learners in respect of different parameters of Open and Distance Education ranging from 59.60% to 84.50% across different parameters of the Attitude scale.

The recommendations based on the above data analysis are that learners have reflected a positive attitude towards the teaching learning process and its various components as follows:

- a) This can be used for systemic improvement in general and learner support system in particular
- b) IGNOU programmes need to focus on developing employability skills as expressed by the learners.
