Monthly Monitoring Report for the month of OCTOBER 2023

The Regional Services Division (RSD) regularly monitors the activities undertaken by the 57 Regional Centres. The RCs undertake various routine activities throughout the year such as promotional-publicity, admissions, examinations, strengthening of learner support centers, monitoring of learner support centers, conduct of academic counselling sessions and induction meetings. RSD obtains monthly data of all the above stated activities from Regional Centers and compiles them as monthly monitoring reports. In addition, the academics of the RC participate in different research and professional development activities which are also collected and compiled in the MMR.

In the last one-two years, the University has transitioned from the ODL to Online mode of programme delivery for which learner support is provided through a wide range of electronic media and digital platforms by the RCs. Further various schemes of the GOI are implemented by the RCs which are UBA, SBA, EBSB, AKAM, HGT etc. In view of this, the MONTHLY MONITORING REPORT format has been modified from January 2023 in line with new activities including the requirement of NAAC matrices which have been shared by CIQA.

Report on activities: Regional Centers ask to share reports of activity/events like Promotional, Induction, Coordinator meetings, Orientation Programme, Seminar, Extension outreach programme, UBA, ECP, innovation etc with GEOTAG pictures in MS Word format.

The Monthly Monitoring Report (MMR) for the month of **OCTOBER 2023** has been compiled by the RSD. The MMR has been presented under various subheadings outlining the Academic Activities of Regional Centers and Learner Support Centers. Further, various Finance & Accounts related matters, i.e., expenditures incurred by Regional Centers and Learner Support Centers have been analyzed. The major components of analysis outlined in the reports have been mentioned below:

- 1.) Promotional, Extension, Outreach Activities & Press release: The analysis includes Digital promotional initiatives/activities like use of digital platforms to enhance outreach. Other analyses include the number of press / media publicity releases. Further, the analysis includes meetings/orientation programs through digital platforms for LSC functionaries.
- 2.) Meeting Training & Orientation Programme: In this section, the information about inhouse meetings, meetings with hqrs, capacity building of LSCs functionaries and orientation programme of the academic counsellors are included. In addition, training programme orgnised for academic counselros and students of handling of Learning Management System (LMS) is also included.
- **3.)** Strengthening/Establishing LSCs and Exam centres: This part consists of the opening of new LSC in the region, activation of new programme at the existing study centers, and empanelment of academic counsellors. Besiudes, establishment of exam centers are included whenever activity carried out.

- **4.) Regional Centres and Learners Support Centres Activities:** The section covers a large number of activities such as induction meetings organised, holding academic counselling sessions for theory and practical courses, project viva-voce held, and assignments submitted and awards transmitted to the hqrs for ODL as well as online programme.
- **5.)** Monitoring of Study Centres & Exam Centers Activities: The section includes participation of regional centers officials during induction meetings, monitoring of counselling sessions held at Learner Support Centers as well as in online mode for ODL and online programme, virtual and physical monitoring of exam centers during the examinations.
- **6.) Student Support Activities**: This part consists of the number of student queries handled, utilization of SMS for communication with students and grievance redressal camps organised by regional centers.
- 7.) Research & Academic Development Activity: This point of analysis encompassed Faculty Development Programme, Webinar/Seminar organized/participated, Radio/TV program etc.
- 8.) Expenditure of Regional Centers (Accounts & Finance): The expenditure incurred for operations of Regional Centers and Learner Support Centers have been analyzed. For the Regional Centre, the points of analysis included Regular Staff Salary, Daily Wage payment, Security, Building Rent, Travel and hiring of taxi, Printing/Publicity, Meeting/workshop/Orientation Programme etc. For the Learner Support Centers, the expenditure was analyzed on the basis of Salary of Part Time functionaries and Counseling, Assignment Evaluation, Practical's etc
- **9.) Staff Strength at Regional Centers:** This part of the report consists of staff strength including academic, non-academic, daily wagers and security personnels posted at regional center.
- **10.) Ratio-Staff, Enrollment, & Expenditure:** Ratio between Staff-enrollment, Staff-expenditure; and Enrollment-expenditure are included.
- 11.) Use of social media: In this section details about the use of various digital and social media by the Regional Centers are included.
- **12.)** Other Events: In addition to the above sections, brief reports on the various events that were held during reporting month were included in the "Other Events" section of MMR.

Executive Summary

MMR OCTOBER 2023 – Executive Summary

The analysis for MMR OCTOBER 2023 is completely based on the data provided by the Regional Centres. As per the practice, the data for the Monthly Monitoring Report (MMR) was received through a filled-in format as well as through the Google Form. Both were received online. The MMR format which was in used earlier has been modified from OCTOBER 2023. Some new features have been included in the MMR format.

The data received from 57 Regional Centres have been analysed in this Executive Summary for MMR- OCTOBER 2023. The analysis has been done under various subheadings for Promotional, extension and outreach activities of the Regional Centres, and Learner Support Centres. Further, various Finance & Accounts related matters, i.e., expenditures incurred by Regional Centres and Learner Support Centres have been analysed. Information related to academic and professional development of the academics of the regional centres has been also compiled and analysed. Immediately following the Executive Summary, data tables pertaining to various activities have been provided. Thereafter, a brief summary of the events held across the country has been provided along with the pictures of those programs.

Promotional, Extension and Outreach Activities

During the month of OCTOBER 2023, Regional Centres organized various promotional and publicity activities. During this time general publicity initiative/activities to enhance outreach, programme specific publicities, efforts for reaching out to the persons who do not have access to higher education like disadvantaged communities e.g., PH, SC/ST, Women etc have been organised by the Regional Centres.

Summary of general and specific publicity and promotional activities carried out in face-to-face mode and online mode has been given in

Table 1. A total of <u>774</u> such activities have been undertaken across all 57 Regional Centres. The list of top ten regional centres in has been given in **Error! Reference source not found.**.









Figure 3 depicts the list of top ten regional centres organised extension activities higher side.


Press Releases Issued

Capacity building and the orientation of part-time functionaries appointed in the learner support centres (LSC) are some of the key activities of regional centres. During the month of OCTOBER 2023, a total of <u>66</u> such activities were undertaken across the regional centres (Table 21). This category involves meetings and orientation of coordinators and PICs of study centres, training of other part-time functionaries, orientation of academic counsellors and a new item which has been included in the MMR from January 2023 is the training programme organized by regional centres for handling of Learning Management System (LMS). 



Regional centres establish <u>exam centres</u> in their respective regions for holding term end exams or conduct of entrance exam for various academic programme. The activity related to exams has been reported during the month.

Regional Centres and Learners Support Centres Activities

Induction meeting (IM) is an important event in IGNOU which is held at the Learner Support Centres (LSC) for newly enrolled students. The goal of this meeting is to familiarize newly admitted students with the open and distance learning system and the way it functions.

During the Corona pandemic, the Learner Support Centres organized this activity virtually. Since all COVID-19 restrictions and prohibitions have been lifted across the country. Face to face and physical activities have been restored to normalcy in the institutions and colleges. Accordingly, some of the LSCs also conducted the IM in face-to-face mode. In addition, induction meetings were also organized separately for the students who had enrolled in an online academic programme. Regional centre-wise details of IM have been given in Table 23.


A total 144 induction meetings (IM) were organised during the OCTOBER 2023 (Table 6), whereas total 27 inductions meetings were organized <u>in face to face for ODL Programme</u>. A total of 96 IMs were organized for students of the ODL program in Online mode during OCTOBER 2023. The university offers academic programme in two different modes – ONLINE mode and Offline (ODL

mode). Hence, the Regional Centres were also asked to provide data for the IM organised for the students enrolled in online programme. The regional centres were organised 48 induction meetings for <u>online academic programme</u>. 






Monitoring of Study Centres Activities

Monitoring Activities by RCs - Monitoring of functioning of Study Centres is one of the important activities of Regional Centres. Monitoring of academic counselling sessions is an important component of this category. The participation of RCs in the induction meeting (IM) is very important part, as academics from the RCs address the new learners during the **induction meeting**. In the reporting month, out of 144 IM organised (Table 6), a total 118 IM were addressed and attended by the academics of the regional centres, which is 81.94% of the total IM organised during the month. Top regional centres where the highest number of academics were attended IM have been given in Figure 12. Regional centres-wise status of induction meetings attended, academic counselling sessions visited, visit of exam and entrance exam centres has been provided in Table 27. Data of monitoring of academic activities of the study centres has been summarised in Table 10 and Table 11.




Handling of student queries and grievances are crucial for effective student support services. All regional centres answer students' issues face-to-face in person as well as via email, telephone, post, Facebook, and other means (Table 30). Table 30 and Table 31 shows the RC-wise information regarding the handling of the total number of students' queries at each regional centre in the month of OCTOBER 2023. Across all Regional centres, a total of 254479 queries were handled/addressed, or responded to. 



<u>Use of SMS</u> is an important mode of communication for the regional centres. It is used to communicate important messages to the learners urgently. For this purpose, Regional Centres use the bulk SMS facilities. 
Greivance redressal

Receiving and resolving student grievances is a crucial part of student support services. During the month, regional centres organized online and face to face mode (offline) grievance redressal camps to address students queries and problems related to their studies. In the month of OCTOBER 2023, all together **86** such camps were held by the regional centres (Table 33). Out of 86, 29 have been organised in face-to-face mode and 57 virtual/online sessions had been hold by the regional centres to resolve students' grievances. The list of top ten regional centres in this category are given in Figure 17.



Research and Academic Development Activities

Regional Centre wise Research and Academic Development activities have been given in Table 40. During the month of OCTOBER, 2023, Regional Centres reported a total of 186 different Research and Academic Development activities including Faculty Development Programme, Webinar/Seminar organized/participated, Radio/TV program and so on (Table 34). Indeed, the top ten regional centres (Figure 18) reported a total 83 such activities accounting for 55.37% of the total during OCTOBER 2023.





Expenditure of Regional Centres

This section of the report deals with the expenses of Regional Centres incurred to meet the functioning of Regional Centres during OCTOBER 2023. The analysis includes the Regional Centre wise total expenditure as well as item-wise expenditures during OCTOBER 2023. The data is provided in Table 35 to 46. Item-wsie summary of expenses has been given in the Table 13. In OCTOBER 2023, a total expenditure of Rs. 158188699/- was incurred across the regional centres (Table 13 and Table 35).






There are Regional Centres which are operational in <u>rented building</u>. Regional Centre wise expenses towards the rent of hiring buildings are given in Table 39 Regional Centre wise expenditure on rent of Regional Centre' Building in OCTOBER 2023. Analysis of data indicates that a sum of Rs. 2794202/- was spent for paying the rent of buildings by the regional centres, which accounted for 1.77% of total expenditure (Rs. 158188699/-) on regional centres functioning. Expenses on **tours and travel**, and hiring taxis are other items of expenditures of regional centres. It shows that Rs. 299935/- was spent to meet the expenses of tours and travels at all the regional centres, which was mere 0.19 % of the total expenditure of Rs. 158188699/- wherein 32 regional centres reported nil expenditure for this item. Figure 25 shows the regional centres with the highest expenditure towards "Travel & Hiring of Taxi".





Next item of analysis is expenditure on <u>meetings, workshops, and orientation</u> programs. Regional Centre wise detailed analysis has been given in Table 41. A total of Rs 217374/- was spent at all the regional centres which was only 0.14% of total expenditure of Rs. 158188699/-. Top regional centres reported expenses under this category are given in Figure 26. Fifty-one regional centres were made nil expenditure under this category.







Expenditures for Functioning of Learner Support Centres

Expenses on the operations and functions of the Learners Support Centres are an important component of the university's expense. The expenses are made for salaries of part time functionaries (PTFs) of study centres as well as payments for academic counselling sessions, evaluation, and other administrative activities. Expenditures incurred for these activities are given in table 44 to 46. As far as salaries of part-time functionaries of study centres is concerned, a sum of Rs. 16198166/-was spent by all the regional centres during OCTOBER 2023 which accounted for 10.24% of total expenditure of Rs. 158188699/- incurred across the regional centres (Table 44). Top-ten regional centres who incurred maximum expenses towards payment of salaries for the Part Time Functionaries have been given in Figure 29. Twenty nine regional centres made nil payment on salaries of part-time functionaries of study centres during OCTOBER 2023.



Regional Centre wise payments made for counselling and evaluation of assignments are given in Table 45. The regional centres spent Rs. 20675836/- on payment of academic counsellors and for assignments evaluation, which accounted for 13.07% of the total expenditures of Rs. 158188699/. Figure 30 illustrates the top-ten regional centres who spent the highest amount for counselling and evaluation of assignments during OCTOBER 2023. No expenditure was reported by the twenty one



Ratio – Expenditure, Enrolment and Staff

The ratio is defined as the relation between two numbers which shows how much bigger one quantity is than another. In this study the ratio between expenditure and staff, expenditure and enrolment, enrolment and staff has been calculated in order to measure the magnitude of regional centres' expenditure corresponding to staff posted as well as corresponding to the number of learners enrolled.

The higher the **Expenditure-to-Staff ratio**, the greater the expenditure per staff member at the Regional Centre, and *vice-versa*. The highest ratio was found in regional centre Jammu, while the lowest was found in regional centre Itanagar (Table 48). **Error! Reference source not found.** shows the regional centres with the highest expenditure-to-staff ratio while **Error! Reference source not found.** depicts the regional centres with the lowest expenditure-to-staff ratio.








Figure 7: Presentation By Mr. Muhammad Khalid Haruna




Figure 9: Learners Presentations received Feedback from the Academic Jury




Figure10: Closing remarks by Dr. Bini Toms

Community Sensitization Program Against Child MarriageKukupangi / 2 October 2023

India reported the highest number of child marriages in the world among other countries where this evil tradition is still in practice. Estimates show around 23.3% of girls between the age group of 20 -24 years have been married before they turned 18. Child marriage must be seen as a serious crime against children that violets their basic human rights. Major girls are forced to turned child brides and face mental trauma, physical and biological stress, loss of education. Our daughters also undergo child bearing at young age, which exposes them to serious health issues and some even die during child birth. World Health Organisation says minor girls are susceptible to Sexually Transmitted Diseases and turn anemicwhen married young. The problem is not only confined to few communities or rural areas butis also accepted as social custom in some religions, where girls after reaching puberty are deemed suitable for marriage even before they reach legal age of consent.

In this context a sensitization program for the community members especially women was organized in Kukupangi village to make the people aware about the consequences of child marriage and their role in prevention.

Location

The sensitization program was organized in Kukupangi village of Hindol block of Dhenkanal district. This is a village with habitation of 384 population dominated by tribal (247). Rest are schedule castes and back ward communities.

Kukupangi village have been selected as one of the adopted villages by Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) Regional Centre, Bhubaneswar and assigned the responsibility to Viswa Yuva Kendra, Angul, a voluntary organization working for the development of the region since last three decades to undertake the activities in the village.

Activity

A half day sensitization program was organized on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti on 2nd October 2023 at

Mr. Manoj Kumar Mohapatra, Director VYK the resource person of the event spoke abut the causes, effect and consequences of child marriage. Dhenkanal is one of the second districts of the state having low sex ratio, high child marriage (more than 25%) and other socialissues like poverty, blind belief and superstitions among tribal. He told that, Child marriage has a significant negative impact on an individual's physical, mental, emotional, and social development and on education and economic opportunities. Both girls and boys are affected by child marriage, but girls are affected in much larger numbers and with greater intensity.

Impact on Girls

- Young girls in marriage are unable to take decisions regarding their body which leads toviolation of their sexual rights.
- Marriage and pregnancy also force girls to drop out from schoolsand are unable to fulfill their aspirations in life.
- Girls face difficulty in adjusting to new family surroundings, are highly prone to domestic violence and subjected to mental trauma.
- Responsibility of managing family and household work at a youngage is a huge psychological burden on girls.
- Child marriage being more common among poor communities, girls also must bear the economic responsibility of the family, pushing her into child-labor.
- Early marriage in case of girl leads to early pregnancy, compromising her rights and choices. Further, adolescent girls are physically and mentally not ready for pregnancy and responsibilities of child care.
- Adolescent pregnancies have serious health consequences both for the mother as well as the child. Infant mortality, maternalmortality, low birthweight, pre-maturity, and poor nutrition are some of the serious negative effects besides a high risk to the girlherself.
- Girls married early are unable to plan their families which results in too early, too closely spaced

and too many pregnancies.

This leads to adverse impact on health and nutrition of the mother and children.

• Girls married at a young age are also highly vulnerable to disappearance/neglected, especially if the husband is also young. There are many reported instances where young husbands do not remain committed to the marriage. The married girls are then found themselves in such a critical situation, where she and her children lives in a state of abandon/destitute with no support or limited support both form their maternal and in-laws.

Impact on Boys

- Child marriage has significant psychological impact on the boys due to sudden increase in family responsibility. Patriarchal norms that mandate men to earn and fulfill the needs of the family resulted in high stress to cope with managing and balancing family responsibility and income and survive and to support his dependents.
- Decline in self-confidence in managing his family, can result in the boy taking refuge in practices like alcohol, drugs and substance abuse.
- Boys too get deprived of education and skills and are compelled to get into unskilled low paid jobs at a very young age because of early marriage.

Mr. Mohapatra spoke about the laws relating the prevention of Child Marriage. He briefed about the Child Marriage Prohibition Act 2006. Finally, he suggested for a collective action of all section of community members to prevent child marriage from the village. A question answer session was also conducted to clarify doubts among the participants. At theend of the session a group pledge was taken by all the members.

The program was ended with vote of thanks by Mr. Girija Nandan Sahoo, Project Counselor, Access to Justice Program of Viswa Yuva Kendra.





Welcome address: Dr.SK.Zareena ARD welcomed the Resource Person Dr. Sultan Ahmed Ismail, Member, State Planning Commission, Government of Tamil Nadu., Sr.Regional Director Dr.K.Panneerselvam, RC Chennai Staff members, Learners for attending the Webinar. Presidential Address: Dr. K.Panneerselvam Sr.Regional Director Addressed the importance conducting the webinar on sustainable development, Importance of reduce, Reuse, Recycle and importance of swatchathahi seva programme, clearing of records, creating the space and revenue generation through waste disposal, advancement in Special Campaign 3.0.

Resource Person: Dr Sultan Ahmed Ismail, Member, State Planning Commission, Government of Tamil Nadu delivered a thought provoking lecture with demonstrations through PPT covering the aspects of importance of Soil, Air, Water, difficulties with Pollution, Plastic usage, Deteriorating soil health has led to a sharp decline in the production of crops since 1990, quoted a recent report by the Delhi-based Indian Society of Soil Science. Extensive use of chemicals kills bacteria and microorganisms in the soil, making land uncultivable. Earthworms and termites are organisms which help increase soil health. In the olden days, after the harvest, the top portion of the crop was used for human consumption, the middle portion was used as a feed for animals and the bottom portion went back to the soil and supported the growth of microorganisms. But today so much salt is being dumped into the soil that it is losing important microbes and land has become uncultivable.

More salt means that the soil demands more water, which has also led to water scarcity in certain areas, The natural composting process goes through a series of biological sub processes: first action by mesophilic microorganisms on the C-substrate—the metabolic process produces heat (raising the temperature of the compost pile)—resulting in a subsequent second action by thermophilic microorganisms. When all of the C-substrate is depleted, the metabolic activity slows down with the temperature dropping and the mesophilic organisms becoming active while the thermophiles become dormant. This is the cure stage. The whole process in a natural system takes about 30 days (minimum). The 24-hour machines do not produce compost. They produce an end product of pulverised material.

Short-circuiting this natural biological process in composting is not acceptable and claims that this 24- or 48-hour thermal treatment process produces "compost" is misleading and wrong. By analogy, a baby takes 9 months in a mother's womb to be fully formed and delivered. One cannot short-circuit this and have a baby delivered in one or two months. One should not violate Nature and its processes if we want to be environmentally responsible. The 24-hour composting machines are just waste disposal or waste reduction machines with or without using microorganisms. These materials can be used as feed. Care must be taken that these end products neither reach the soil nor the feed because stabilisation continues till completion of the decomposition of degradable organic compounds and re-organisation of other organic substances, which takes its own time depending on the constituents. There is no microorganism so far found that can hasten this process to be completed in 24 hours. If this "compost" is used without full stabilisation, it may prove to be harmful to the plants and also to the soil. This 24-hour process from machines can be useful probably to reduce the volume of waste for landfilling or for further processing.



The webinar ended with a formal vote of thanks by Dr A Rahman, Assistant Regional Director, IGNOU RC Delhi 2







Orientation programme for LSC functionaries for Assignment- RC Delhi-2








4. Online Coordinators Meeting




Organisation of Online and Face to Face Theory counselling classes

2) Mission LiFE Reduce, Reuse and Recycle under special campaign 3.0:

Under these missions, RC has undertaken the following things:

A) Retorsion of the Chairs: Several years ago, IGNOU supplied chairs made from iron frame-plastic cord (Make: Godrej), which were unused and dumped in study centers and regional centers. We are currently gathering these unused chairs, damaged items, and outdated study materials, from study centers to create more space in the Learning Support Centers (LSCs). Some LSCs returned these chairs to the Regional Center. Upon inspection, it was determined that these chairs could be repaired since their bases were still in good condition. One of our part-time staff members possesses the necessary skills to restore these chairs, making them appear as good as new, at a cost of Rs 500/- per chair. So far, 20 such chairs have been successfully repaired, and an additional 30 chairs are slated for restoration soon.

B) Retrofitting the Iron Steel self for storing study materials: Numerous steel racks in the storage area are in a damaged state. Due to the lack of bookshelves, study materials are placed on the floor. These racks are being fixed, painted, and restructured. Currently, 15 racks have been



fully restored and are being utilized to store study materials.

C) Refurbishing of old Computers (desktop and laptop): Several computers (supplied by IGNOU in the year 2007) are not operating efficiently due to outdated hardware, causing staff members to experience slowdowns and other problems with software compatibility etc. Following discussions with experts, it was decided to upgrade a few desktop computers to ensure smooth day-to-day operations. Consequently, four computers were fully upgraded at a cost of Rs 18,000 per computer. Additionally, the RAM of another four computers was partially upgraded to



facilitate online exams. These upgraded computers have been working satisfactorily. Furthermore,

viewing the increases in the enrollment of online program and computers will be upgraded as per requirement requirements.

3) Arrangement of Study material and creation of space under special campaign 3.0:

In recent months, RC has been receiving educational materials from MPDD. We refurbish numerous deteriorated iron racks that are used for storing these study materials. The old racks which are in a state of disrepair, are exclusively utilized for this purpose. RC has also notified the study center to return outdated study materials and obsolete electronic items provided by IGNOU periodically. This initiative aims to free up space at the study center, addressing numerous complaints about space constraints.


Write Up about the activity:
