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The Chairperson welcomed all members to the 75th Meeting of the School Board of the School of Social Sciences.

At the outset, the Chairperson welcomed the members and placed on record sincere appreciation and contribution made by the outgoing external members of the School Board, namely Prof. S. Karunanidhi, Prof. Prem Vashishta, Prof. Sanjay K. Bhardwaj, Prof. Tiplut Nongbri and Prof. Subhadra M Channa for their support and advice during their tenure. She welcomed the new external members of the School Board, namely Prof. Gautam K. Kshatriya, Prof. C. Sheela Reddy, Dr. Jagdish Arora, Prof. A.R. Khan and Prof. Virginius Xaxa, and look forward to the guidance during their tenure.

The Chairperson apprised the Board about the University in general and activities undertaken by the School in particular.

- Indira Gandhi National Open University has been accredited with NAAC A++ Grade with a total score of 3.56 on a 4 point scale, result of commitment, dedication and hard work of IGNOU team for last 34 years.
- She informed that IGNOU would be implementing University Grants Commission approved two credit Course 'Research and Publication Ethics' compulsory for all Ph.D students in their pre-registration course work. The course would be in workshop mode across all the disciplines of the University & Discipline of Library & Information Science will be nodal Discipline for coordinating the academic part and would be assisted by other disciplines too.
- School of Social Sciences will provide support to National Centre for Disability Studies to facilitate our learner with special needs for BAG Programme by providing information to be disseminated in Sign Language.
- M.A. in Political Science was adjudged as the Best Academic Programme in ODL, launched by IGNOU under Masters Degree Programme. The School shared Best Academic Programme Award for Bachelor's of Arts under Bachelor's Degree Programme Category with School of Humanities. These were awarded in the 35th Foundation Day celebration held on November 19, 2020.
- The Chairperson also shared the fresh admission for July 2020 admission to various Programmes- Certificate, Diploma, CBCS Programme and Postgraduate level. Out of the total admission of all the programmes across the Schools, School of Social Sciences has about 50% enrollment. Amongst the undergraduate Programmes BAG has highest number of admission and seven Disciplines of School of Social Sciences has major contributions. School of Social Sciences offers Honours Programmes under CBCS at undergraduate level in seven disciplines – Anthropology, Economics, History, Political Science, Psychology, Public Administration and Sociology. History and Political Science Disciplines have more than 10,000 in July 2020 session.
- An impressive fresh admission is seen at Master's level too across the University. Political Science, History, Sociology and Psychology have enrolment of more than 10,000 learners.
- The School is currently involved in the development of Honours and B.A. (General) courses as per Choice Based Credit System. The Courses are bilingual in nature English and Hindi.

This course is to be offered in the 4th Semester in the coming July session as part of the B.Sc. Honours (in Anthropology) Programme.

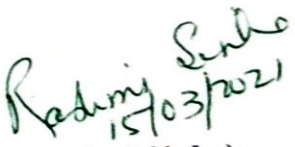
SB 75.35(2).1 The Board considered and recommended the list of Evaluators for all courses of BAPAH: B.A. (Hons.) and B.A. (General) Programme in Public Administration. It was decided to put up the recommendation of the Board to the Vice-Chancellor for consideration and approval. (Annexure-27)

SB 75.35(3) To consider and approve the proposal for Plagiarism check of the Project Reports relating to the Course MECP-101, an optional course of the MA Economics Programme

SB 75.35(3).1 The members discussed the Report of the Committee on Plagiarism check of the Project Reports in detailed manner. Keeping in view the difficulties to be faced by the students and by External Evaluators due to non-accessibility of software facility to them and complications involved in interpretation of the results of the software, for the time being, it was decided that conducting viva-voce of Project report as a part of evaluation process may be added. The recommendations of the Committee 'Viva-Voce as compulsory component of evaluation assigning 30% weightage to Viva-Voce and 70% to the Project Report' may be accepted. Each student will be required to get 40% qualifying marks for both the components separately. Viva-Voce will be taken by the evaluator through any means of technology i.e. google meet, whatsapp, skype etc. Since Viva-Voce has already been a component of evaluation in the matter of projects of two disciplines Anthropology and Psychology, this provision may be extended to the evaluation of project reports of M.A. Economics Programme. The preventive measures recommended by the committee need to be incorporated in the project guides of all five disciplines – Anthropology, Economics, Library & Information Science, Psychology and Public Administration.

SB 75.35(3).2 The Board considered and approved the above said recommendations of the Committee.
