57.17	To consider and approve the establishment of the Discipline of Linguistics in the School of Humanities  The focus of School of Humanities has largely been literature, literary and criticism and cultural studies. It has been found that because we do not offer substantial papers in linguistics, our students are disadvantaged in that they develop merely a surface understanding of these areas as well. <b>The discipline of linguistics will fill in this vacuum leading to a better understanding of both</b>

	<p>literature as well as culture. One of the primary goals of the Linguistics programme is to heighten our awareness of the complex nature of language and its importance in daily life. Students would especially value linguistics because they will be able to identify the deeper meanings behind their own communication with others while also trying to understand the subliminal messages behind how others communicate with them.</p> <p>We intend to introduce Linguistics at both the Bachelor as well as the Masters level. However, we will begin with the Master's level.</p> <p><b>The Board considered and recommended the establishment of the Discipline of Linguistics in the School of Humanities.</b></p>

It deals with life and thinking about the world, the universe, and society. It works by asking very basic questions about the nature of human thought and behavior, the nature of the universe, and the connections between them.</p> <p>In IGNOU, two programmes B.A. in Philosophy and M.A. in Philosophy is being offered by the School of Inter-Disciplinary and Trans-Disciplinary Studies (SOITS) but a Philosophy Discipline has not been created and faculty not appointed.</p> <p>It is proposed to establish the Discipline of Philosophy in the School of Humanities and thereafter house the related programmes on offer, under the school of Humanities.</p> <p><b>The Board considered and recommended the transfer of the Discipline of Philosophy to the School of Humanities.</b></p>
57.19	<p>To consider and approve the establishment of the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Chair in the School of Humanities</p> <p>Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyay is one of the leading thinkers of</p>

Modern India. He raised from grim childhood circumstances to blossom into a gifted orator and thinker. His contribution to the field of politics as a vital and active member of the Jana Sangh apart, his ideas related to the individual and society as expressed through the term “Integral Humanism”, has been considered a distinct school of thought – an ‘ism’ or a philosophy, a ‘darshan’.

While Indian philosophical thought in the last two centuries underscored the essential differences and conflicts between Western and Eastern thought – most prominently by Swami Vivekananda, Lokmanya Tilak and Mahatma Gandhi – Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyay analyzed and presented what he envisioned as a solution to this conflict. In the two lectures that articulated his ideas, he sought to bring together both the streams of the principles of Individualism and Socialism from the West and an understanding of the relation and integration of the individual and society through shiksha, karma, yogakshem and yagya leading to the realization of the objectives of dharma, artha, kama and moksha – a uniquely Eastern perspective of human life. The concept of ‘Integral Humanism’ is thus, essentially Indian wherein it is stressed that the progress of humankind can come about only through the progress of the body, mind, intellect and soul and it is at the core of Indian culture which looks upon life as a holistic whole.

It is essential to learn from the past and from other cultures without repeating their mistakes and without mindlessly and blindly imitating them. A life thus led would be a harmonious one, full of the best values of the world, in a society in which, to borrow a thought from Mahatma Gandhi, the windows and doors would be wide open to allow the wafting in of the fragrance of multiple ideas and reflections. The School of Humanities proposes to establish the Deen Dayal Upadhyay Chair which would, in an increasingly discordant world, serve to emphasise, in his words, the need for harmony between the individual and the Supreme Collectively and would offer a lens to view conflict as a sign of cultural regression.
